OPERATIONS SECTION CHIEF (OSC):

The OSC is a member of the General Staff responsible for the management of tactical operations directly in support of the primary mission. The OSC is normally selected from the organization with the most jurisdictional or functional responsibility for the incident. The OSC activates and supervises ICS organization elements in accordance with the Incident Action Plan (IAP), and directs IAP implementation. The OSC also directs the preparation of operational plans, requests or releases resources, monitors operational progress, makes expedient changes to the IAP when necessary, and reports those changes to the Incident Commander/Unified Command.

Building upon the basic foundations of the Incident Command System, Operation Section Chief Workshop is designed to provide government and private industry emergency management and response personnel with an understanding of the duties, responsibilities, and capabilities of an effective Operations Section Chief (OSC).
